

Position Description and Qualification: WREMAC Preceptor

About:

A WREMAC preceptor is authorized to verify competency for the required annual skills as detailed in WREMAC Policy #2013-1. A preceptor may verify competency up to his/her privilege level within the WREMAC.

Preceptor Qualifications:

Candidates shall be considered qualified upon meeting all requirements, as follows:

- 1. Valid NYS Certification as an EMT, EMT-Intermediate, AEMT, EMT-CC, or Paramedic
- Active membership in an EMS agency within the WREMAC catchment area (Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie, Genesee, Niagara, Orleans, and Wyoming Counties)
- 3. Approval from the Agency Medical Director(s).
- 4. Successful completion of the WREMAC Preceptor Training Course or meet the "Alternative Qualification" requirements detailed below.

Alternative Qualification:

A Certified Lab Instructor (CLI) or Certified Instructor Coordinator (CIC) with a valid, not expired, NYS instructor certification is eligible for WREMAC preceptor privileges. The CLI/CIC must notify the regional EMS program agency of their intent to serve as a WREMAC preceptor and, if requested, provide verification of their NYS instructor certification.

A CLI/CIC is encouraged to attend a WREMAC Preceptor Training Course.

Validation Period:

Preceptor privileges are valid until any of the following occurs:

- 1. The preceptor's NYS provider certification lapses; or
- 2. The preceptor is taken off-line for a patient care concern; or
- The preceptor fails to meet the requirements set forth in WREMAC Policy #2013-1;
- 4. The preceptor privileges are revoked by the medical director or WREMAC.

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
